WEE BACKPACKERS

4 & 5 years old, including campers entering Kindergarten in fall, 2012

June 11 – August 24

Start your preschooler's love affair with the great outdoors by enrolling him or her in Wee Backpackers! From the moment campers arrive each day, counselors guide them through traditional camp experiences including hiking, nature study, canoeing, archery, and arts and crafts. They will have opportunities to savor the wonderful flavors of outdoor cookouts, sing songs, tell stories, meet new friends, and more. All activities are geared to show your camper the wonders of nature. Wee Backpackers is carried out under the watchful eye of counselors trained to meet the needs of young campers. We maintain a staff to child ratio of 1:8.

Campers let their imaginations soar in this magical fairy tale-themed arts and crafts camp! Participants make dragon and fairy wings, prince and princess crowns, wands, jewels, fairy tale puppets, costumes and more. Kids will also enjoy a special tea party!

ARTS AND CRAFTS CAMP

Entering grades 2 – 5 in fall, 2012

Weekly from of June 11 – August 17

Campers discover their artistic side and let their imaginations soar. Kids create through a variety of projects that may include: clay sculpture, sketching, watercolors or paints, nature collages, weaving a potholder or placemat, scrap booking, papier maché, picture frames, candle holders, necklaces and bracelets, mural painting and much more! FISHING CAMP

Entering grades 3 – 6 in fall, 2012

Weeks of June 18, June 25, July 9, July 16, July 23, July 30, August 6 and August 13

Get hooked on fishing and learn basic fishing skills. Beautiful Lake Minnetonka provides the scene for shoreline fishing fun using the catch-and-release method. Bait is provided at camp, but campers must bring their own pole and tackle.

FARM CAMP

Entering grades 2 – 6 in fall, 2012

Members: \$210/week

Program Participants: \$230/week

Weeks of June 18 and July 16

Join us for a week of wholesome fun at Gail Woods Farm! Kids working the farm will explore the barn and acres of gardens, pastures, fields, and forests. Young farmers experience the daily routines of feeding and caring for sheep, cattle, chickens, cats and a dog. Campers discover how plants, animals, soil, and people work together to produce the food that we eat everyday. Plus, they'll learn how to use fresh produce in your own cooking and what it means to be a good steward in this unique farming experience.



ARCHERY CAMP

Entering grades 3 – 6 in fall, 2012

Members: \$190/week

Program Participants: \$210/week

Weeks of June 11, June 25, July 2*, July 9, July 23, July 30, August 6 and August 20

While learning the fundamentals of archery, campers examine equipment close up, identify the parts of the bow and arrow, and learn the science behind drawing the bow and releasing the arrow. Instructors teach proper grip, stance, and aim alignment to use while approaching the target. Campers will discover their 'eye dominance,' the first step in becoming a skilled archer.

Archery Camp uses more advanced equipment such as Genesis Bows. Equipment is provided.

WATER SPORTS CAMP

Entering grades 4 – 6 in fall, 2012

Campers try a variety of water sports activities including one-on-one water-ski instruction, canoeing/kayaking and tubing. Kids spend about 2 hours each day on water activities.

CANOE/KAYAK CAMP

Entering grades 4 – 7 in fall, 2012

Members: \$205/week

Program Participants: \$225/week

Weeks of June 18, July 9, July 23, August 6 and August 20

Campers learn paddling skills and canoe/kayak safety as they experience the beauty of Camp Christmas Tree's Dutch Lake! Kids learn to identify the parts of the canoe and learn the key strokes of canoeing and kayaking, along with the importance of weight distribution and center of gravity. An adventure through Dutch Lake will test their skills and we'll enjoy a lunch on the lake.

OUTDOOR LIVING SKILLS CAMP

Entering grades 3 – 5 in fall 2012

Members: \$205/week

Program Participants: \$225/week

Weeks of June 25, July 16, July 30 and August 13

Kids develop their outdoor living skills in this exciting, hands-on specialty camp! Campers discover the finer points of preparing for a big outdoor adventure and will develop orienteering skills using a map and compass plus they'll learn about plant and animal identification. Participants will also learn a variety of useful camping skills including building a fire, making camp shelters, knot tying, campfire cooking and more!

CLIMBING CAMP

Entering grades 5 – 7 in fall, 2012

Members: \$210/week

Program Participants: \$230/week

Weeks of June 25, July 9, July 23 and August 6

Campers put their strength, strategy, and skill against our 50-foot rock climbing tower in a spectacular outdoor setting! During daily practice climbing sessions, kids learn about basic climbing footings and grips, belay techniques, knot tying, and climbing safety. On Friday, campers test their climbing skills on one of YMCA Camp Ihduhapi's high adventure elements!

END OF SUMMER EXTRAVAGANZA

Entering grades 1 – 8 in fall, 2012

Members: \$205/week

Program Participants: \$225/week

August 27 – 31

This is the last chance to enjoy the great outdoors at camp before summer ends! We've combined all of our camp's highlights into an incredible jam-packed session. Horseback rides, canoeing, swimming are all part of the fun. Campers search for "silver" and "gold" in the Gold Rush, then cash in their treasure chest in exchange for fun surprises!

Please note: There will be no Family Night held during Extravaganza week.

HORSE CAMP PROGRAMS

Come experience the joys of horseback riding at Horse Camp! Camp Christmas Tree's riding programs are progressively structured to provide campers with a fun experience of interacting with gentle horses. Instructors are trained in horsemanship and carefully match the experience level of the child with an appropriate horse. Instruction is provided at the staging area and on the horses.

Safety is our top priority at Horse Camp. For all horse programs, we recommend that participants wear heeled leather shoes or boots. Long pants and protective helmets are required of all participants. Helmets will be provided by the camp. Our Horse Camp is a progressive recreational riding program and is not intended to replace formal riding lessons.

Alternative programs may be planned if weather conditions such as extreme heat, rain, or wind jeopardize the safety of campers or horses.



COLTS 1-HOUR PROGRAM, INTRODUCTORY LEVEL

Entering grades 2 – 6 in fall, 2012

Members: \$260/week

Program Participants: \$290/week

Weekly from June 11 – August 24

Colts is a 1-hour-per-day introductory program for children with little experience around horses. First-time riders will build confidence and skills while learning the basics of western horseback riding. Instruction includes safety, leading, mounting, dismounting, reining, and basic ring riding. The remainder of the day is spent in Traditional Camp activities.

BUCKAROOS 1-HOUR PROGRAM INTERMEDIATE LEVEL

Entering grades 3 – 6 in fall, 2012

Previous Colts experience preferred.

Members: \$260/week

Program Participants: \$290/week

Weekly from June 11 – August 24

Buckaroos is an intermediate program for campers with at least one year of riding experience. One hour of daily instruction includes a basic skill review, intermediate ring riding, and trotting. The remainder of the day is spent in traditional camp activities.

CIRCLE Y CAMP – 2-WEEK SESSION ADVANCED LEVEL

Entering grades 4 – 6 in fall, 2012

Riders must demonstrate strong proficiency at basic riding skills and have completed Buckaroos.

Members: \$540/two-week session

Program Participants: \$580/two-week session

Bi-weekly June 18 – August 24

In Circle Y Camp, experienced riders spend 10 hours per week in advanced riding instruction including mounting, trotting, and ring work. Riders also learn about proper horse care such as feeding, grooming, and saddling. Circle Y riders showcase their skills in a special horse show. This program also includes an overnight at YMCA Camp Christmas Tree.

At each YMCA Specialty Camp, day campers spend approximately two hours of each day in their specialized activity. The remainder of the day is spent enjoying Traditional Camp activities. Samples of a typical day can be found at daycampchristmastree.org.

TEEN SPECIALTY CAMPS



Developing leadership qualities and abilities are important life-long ingredients. Our leadership camps develop the whole person — spirit, mind, and body — through a variety of service projects, hands-on activities, and team building exercises. Our leaders of tomorrow begin with our youth of today!

TEEN QUEST

Entering grades 6 – 8 in fall, 2012

Members: \$200/week

Program Participants: \$220/week

Weeks of June 25, July 9, July 23 and August 6

Teen Quest is an exciting day camp program geared toward teens that want total outdoor fun! As a group quest, participants will decide and plan out many of the camp activities and events throughout the week. This program develops valuable life skills such as open communication, team building, cooperation and conflict resolution. Campers choose from a variety of activities including recreational lake swimming, canoeing and kayaking along the shores, climbing the rock/obstacle tower, nature studies, environmental education, service projects and much more.

Teen Quest campers will have a climbing experience at YMCA Camp Ihduhapi on Friday.

LEADERS-IN-TRAINING

Entering grades 7 – 9 in fall, 2012

Members: \$270/two-week session

Program Participants: \$290/two-week session

Bi-weekly: June 18 – August 24

Includes overnight at Camp Christmas Tree

Teens rise to the challenge of Leaders-in-Training Camp and discover their leadership qualities. Participants will learn and develop camp skills needed to lead camper activities, including personal development through confidence building and responsibility management, as well as group development through activity planning and event organization. They'll have opportunities to shadow counselors of younger campers and assist staff in their camp activities. There will also be plenty of time to hang out with friends – new and old. Come experience camp from a whole new perspective!

PEAK ADVENTURE CAMP

Entering grades 7 – 9 in fall, 2012

Fee: \$330/3-day session

Offered: Various dates on 3 day-sessions below

Discover Camp Christmas Tree's wild side! Participants enjoy the great outdoors during Peak Adventure Camp week filled with outdoor adventures and lasting memories. Campers meet new friends and learn new skills as they enjoy hiking, outdoor cooking, campfires, and swimming. Teens go white water rafting the St. Louis River in Duluth or camp and explore Devils Lake in Wisconsin. This camp promises unlimited fun!

WHITE WATER RAFTING

Offered June 19 – 21 and June 26 – 28 (3-day session)

This is an adrenaline elevator! On Tuesday, we depart Camp Christmas Tree and travel to Duluth to ride the wild rapids of the St. Louis River. Then we'll set up camp for the night and fix dinner over a fire. We'll hike, swim and settle in for two nights of camping on the North Shore. The adventure ends on Thursday when we will return to Camp Christmas Tree in time to ride the bus home. It's extreme fun!

WISCONSIN DELL'S OUTDOOR ADVENTURE

Offered July 10 – 12 and July 24 – 26 (3-day session)

Fully experience the great outdoors! Tent camp for two nights with us at Devils Lake State Park in Baraboo, WI. On Tuesday we leave Day Camp Christmas Tree for Devils Lake State Park. Once camp is set up, the adventures begin! Wednesday is spent at a water park in the WI Dells. We'll explore the park and enjoy group games, hike, swim and end with a blazing campfire and a hearty meal. On Thursday we will return to Camp Christmas Tree in time to ride the bus home. Join us for this thrilling outdoor adventure!

NORTH SHORE

Offered July 17 – 19 and July 31 – August 2 (3-day session)

This 3-day, 2-night trip along the beautiful North Shore of Lake Superior is a memory in the making. We will enjoy scenic stops including Alpine Sliding at Lutsen Ski Resort, tour Split Rock Lighthouse plus other activities in Duluth. Our group will camp overnight at Temperance River State Park or Gooseberry Falls State Park. Your adventuresome camper will love this getaway.





TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

The YMCA provides safe and reliable transportation each day for our campers to begin their adventure! Bus stop locations are available throughout the communities listed. Transportation is provided by YMCA-owned vans, leased vans, and buses. All drivers have completed special training.

Transportation is provided to and from camp. Convenient locations have been selected in your neighborhood. Please select only one bus stop on the registration form.

- Buses do not return home from Camp on Thursday afternoons!
- Camp buses only stop at locations listed on schedule.
- Actual pick up spot may change from week to week due to location requirements; please give yourselves a few extra minutes to locate the bus on Monday mornings.
- Traffic congestion and road construction may slightly affect actual times.
- The bus sites are not supervised before pick up times or after drop off times.
- Please be on time, as your delay will affect others. Campers not picked up by an adult on the list will be brought back to the Ridgedale YMCA.

BEFORE AND AFTER CARE

For your convenience and peace of mind, our Before and After Care provides the camper with supervised activities prior to and following the end of the program day. Before and After Care is only provided at the Ridgedale YMCA.

Pick up: 5 p.m. – 6 p.m.

Fee: \$30 per week for Before and After Camp Care





How to Register:

- One child per registration form. Download a copy or register online at ymcatwincities.org.
- Completely fill out the Registration form, Emergency/Health form and Release, Indemnification and Hold Harmless Agreement. (3 pages total for each child)
- Make selections by checking the fee boxes for the sessions you wish to attend. Check "M" for YMCA facility members and "P" for program participant (non-member) rate. Membership must be current at the time of registration and program attendance for member rates to apply.
- A \$50 non-refundable deposit is required per camp session. The deposit is applied to the session fee.

- Confirmation will be sent after registration has been entered into the Y system. You will be billed for the remaining balance, due the week prior to the start of the session. You may authorize automatic electronic fund transfer (EFT) on your registration, which will be processed the Tuesday prior to each program session week.
- Changes to the original registration, including cancellation, must be made in writing by Monday, one week prior to the start of the session. We encourage change notices to be submitted as soon as possible. If the change notice is not received, you will be billed for the original enrollment choices. **For Day Camp:** A \$10 change fee is applied to each change that is made. There are no refunds on registration deposits and/or registration fees.

Release, Indemnification and Hold Harmless Agreement

In consideration of participating in YMCA activities, and for other good and valuable consideration, I hereby agree to **release and discharge from liability** arising from negligence the **YMCA of the Greater Twin Cities** and its owners, directors, officers employees, agents, volunteers, participants, and all other persons or entities acting for them (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Releasees"), on behalf of myself and my children, parents, heirs, assigns, personal representative and estate, and also agree as follows:

- 1. I acknowledge that participating in YMCA activities involves known and unanticipated risks which could result in physical or emotional injury, paralysis or permanent disability, death, and property damage. Risks include, but are not limited to, broken bones, torn ligaments or other injuries as a result of falls or contact with other participants; death as a result of drowning or brain damage caused by near drowning in pools or other bodies of water; medical conditions resulting from physical activity; and damaged clothing or other property. I understand such risks simply cannot be eliminated, despite the use of safety equipment, without jeopardizing the essential qualities of the activity.
- 2. I **expressly accept and assume all of the risks inherent in this activity or that might have been caused by the negligence of the Releasees.** My child's participation in these activities is purely voluntary and I elect to have my child participate despite the risks. In addition, if at any time I believe that event conditions are unsafe or that my child is unable to participate due to physical or medical conditions, then I will immediately discontinue my child's participation.
- 3. I **hereby voluntarily release, forever discharge, and agree to indemnify and hold harmless Releasees from any and all claims, demands, or causes of action which are in any way connected with my child's participation in these activities, or my child's use of their equipment or facilities, arising from negligence. This release does not apply to claims arising from intentional conduct.** Should Releasees or anyone acting on their behalf be required to incur attorney's fees and costs to enforce this agreement, I agree to indemnify and hold them harmless for all such fees and costs.

- 4. I represent that I have adequate insurance to cover any injury or damage I or my child may suffer or cause while participating in this activity, or else I agree to bear the costs of such injury or damage myself. I further represent that my child has no medical or physical condition which could interfere with his/her safety in these activities, or else I am willing to assume – and bear the costs of – all risks that may be created, directly or indirectly, by any such condition.
- 5. In the event that I file a lawsuit, I agree to do so in the state where Releasees' facility is located, and I further agree that the substantive law of that state shall apply.
- 6. I agree that if any portion of this agreement is found to be void or unenforceable, the remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

By signing this document, I agree that if my child is hurt or property damaged during my child's participation in this activity, then I and my child may be found by a court of law to have waived our right to maintain a lawsuit against the parties being released on the basis of any claim for negligence.

I have had sufficient time to read this entire document and, should I choose to do so, consult with legal counsel prior to signing. Also, I understand that this activity might not be made available to my child or that the cost to engage in this activity would be significantly greater if I were to choose not to sign this release, and agree that the opportunity to participate at the stated cost in return for the execution of this release is a reasonable bargain. **I have read and understood this document and I agree to be bound by its terms.**

Parent/Guardian Authorization

- 1. In the event that my child needs immediate medical attention for injuries received while participating in a YMCA program, I authorize the YMCA staff to give my child reasonable first aid, and to arrange transport of my child to a health care facility for emergency services as needed.
- 2. I agree to the release of any records necessary for treatment, referral, billing or insurance purposes. The YMCA receives medical information on campers/participant that may need to be shared with medical providers.
- 3. My child has my permission to be transported by the YMCA as needed for field trips, inclement weather, or late pick up. I also give my permission to participate in walking field trips.
- 4. I hereby acknowledge that the YMCA will assume that either parent of the child may pick up the child at any time during the program unless there is pertinent court documentation on file at the YMCA that indicates otherwise.
- 5. I hereby release all pictures of my child taken by the YMCA for promotional purposes and programming materials including the YMCA website.
- 6. If my child requires use and administration of an epi-pen, it is my responsibility to ensure that the epi-pen is on my child or within their personal belongings every day of the program. If YMCA staff is required to administer and use the epi-pen, I agree to forever release and discharge the YMCA and it's directors, officers, and employees from any and all liability arising out of or resulting from use or administration of the epi-pen.
- 7. I give my permission for the YMCA to administer sunscreen as needed.
